About Us



The Party Kit Network CIC is a social enterprise committed to making reusable tableware an accessible and practical eco-friendly alternative to disposables.

Part of the emerging sharing economy, party kits are locally run boxes of reusable tableware and decorations. Kits are lent within the community for events and returned to be used again.

The Party Kit Network aims to connect those planning a party with their local party kit and works to support those who run kits.

Starting in the UK as a community project in June 2019, we registered as a Community Interest Company (limited by guarantee) in July 2020. We now have over 520 members providing access to party kits across 9 countries.

The Problem





A Care Bears-themed birthday party in 1987. As guests delved into their party bags used tableware was binned, destined for landfill.

Not much has changed - disposable tableware is just as prevalent now. Difficult to recycle, they can take years to breakdown. The plastic tableware from that party in 1987 is likely still in a landfill today.

Switching to reusables offers the most sustainable solution. If used at least 10 times(1), a reusable plastic cup has a lower environmental impact than that of a disposable one. And as part of a party kit, cups will get used many many times more.



It is estimated that England uses 1.1 billion single-use plates each year - equivalent to 20 per person.(2)



Paper plates are most commonly made from wood pulp with a polythene coating, which come from carbon-busting trees and oil.



Paper plates with food or grease residue cannot be recycled.



Eco-friendly or 'compostable' disposable tableware may come from renewable sources but still have a significant carbon footprint.

Introduction



In the last 12 months our network has continued to grow and have an impact on waste. As our members have reopened their kits following the end of COVID gathering restrictions, party kits have been used by more people at more parties than ever before.

In the UK the Platinum Jubilee gave us the opportunity increase awareness of just how practical reusable tableware can be. We contributed to Waitrose Weekend Magazine and the Big Jubilee Lunch website.

It's been a busy year; I was proud to be included on the Women in Social Enterprise Top 100 List for 2022 and to write for the Plastic Free July blog (which was done while also holding my new 4-week-old baby!). This summer I had the opportunity to work with students from the University of Winchester on the Social Innovation Programme run by Student Hubs looking at how we could develop our partnerships.

This year has seen more governments take action against waste with Scotland, Queensland and Western Australia all introducing bans on single-use plastic plates and cutlery. The power of party kits has never been more relevant.

Thank you to our board members and to Erin Rhoads, Amanda Hepburn, Michelle Nitz (HoneyStone Accounting), and Elisabeth Hall and Mary Connors from the 'We Make Change' project. Each have donated their time and expertise to support us. And huge thank you to all of our members for joining me in making reusables an accessible alternative to single-use tableware.





Our Income & Spend



In 2021-22 we spent just under £1,000. Our costs are low because everyone who works on the Network donates their time.

Funding continues to be a challenge - we do not charge members a fee or take commission from any referrals. The income from Party Kit Winchester (the only kit owned and operated by the Network) grew by +350% so covered a larger proportion of our costs this year.
